

PINOT NOIR LES VERGERS

Domaine du Burignon

AOC Lavaux, Saint-Saphorin Grand Cru

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Perched on the heights of Saint-Saphorin, the Burignon estate is one of the three Lausanne wine enclaves in Lavaux.

In 1802, during the sale of national properties, Lausanne acquired these vineyards, covering an area of around 6 hectares.

A sandy, light soil, which allows a deep rooting, a slope on the hillside of between 35% and 50%, many stone walls which reflect the heat, the plots of Burignon offer a perfect representation of the soil of Lavaux, where the wines are at one with the terroir.

- South-west on a hillside with a steep slope (35 to 50%)
- Sandy fluvioglacial moraine
- Pinot Noir
- Simple Guyot, terraced vineyard
- Ageing in wooden vase for 12 months



TASTING

Bright, light red colour with pink reflections. The nose is reminiscent of Pinot Noir and sour cherries from the neighbour's old orchard. The attack is subtle, with a beautiful roundness with fine tannins and a slight minerality.



FOOD AND WINE PAIRING

A pleasant wine to taste at the end of the week on a pretty terrace. To be served at 16°C. This wine is the perfect match with poultry simply roasted with seasonal vegetables or with chicken breasts prepared with tarragon.
